Mission of the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation

The mission of the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation (GCF) is to ensure public awareness of gynecologic cancer prevention, early diagnosis and proper treatment. In addition the Foundation supports research and training related to gynecologic cancers. GCF advances this mission by increasing public and private funds that aid in the development and implementation of programs to meet these goals.

GCF programs are designed to:

- 1) Increase public awareness of ways to prevent, detect and treat gynecologic cancers;*
- 2) Increase public awareness of the central role of gynecologic oncologists in these activities;*
- 3) Train a cadre of clinicians/scientists to participate in clinically relevant research in collaboration with the National Cancer Institute;*
- 4) Support promising, innovative research related to malignancies arising in gynecologic organs.*

GCF is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code Tax Exempt number is 36-3797707.

GCF Funded Programs 2003

Research Grants and Awards

In June, GCF mailed the Research Grants and Awards booklet to all of SGO/GCF members. The research booklet describes grants and training announcements, and history of GCF research grant award winners and GCF/NCI Fellows. This year's winners for GCF awards are as follows:

GCF/Ann Schreiber Ovarian Cancer Research Grant

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support research focused around early detection, screening and basic translational research in ovarian cancer. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Robert Giuntoli, II, M.D., Johns Hopkins Medicine was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for his application entitled, "*Ex Vivo Expansion and Identification of Ovarian Cancer Cytotoxic T Lymphocytes.*"

GCF/Cytoc Health Corporation Gynecologic Cancer Research Grant

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support research related to identification or evaluation of novel molecular markers involved in the development of intraepithelial neoplasia of the cervix, breast, endometrium or ovary. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Eugene Toy, M.D., University of Rochester was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for his application entitled, "*PDIP38, a Novel Protein Marker for Early HPV Infection.*"

GCF/Eli Lilly and Company Ovarian Cancer Research Grant

This research project is for one year at \$25,000. This program is intended to support research related to ovarian cancer. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Matthew Anderson, M.D., MD Anderson Cancer Center was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for his application entitled, "*Dissecting the Role of AIB-1 in Ovarian Epithelial Invasiveness.*"

GCF/Florence & Marshall Schwid Ovarian Cancer Grant

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support innovative research related to ovarian cancer and assists the investigator in bridging long term funding. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Cheryl Saenz, M.D., University of California, San Diego was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for her application entitled, "*Treatment of Terminal Metastatic Ovarian Cancer by Therapeutic siRNAs.*"

GCF/GlaxoSmithKline Therapeutic Approaches to Relapsed Ovarian Cancer Grant

This research project is for one year at \$25,000. This program is intended to support research related to relapsed ovarian cancer. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Linda Duska, M.D., Massachusetts General Hospital was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for her application entitled, "*Testing the Significance of Cables Expression in Identifications and Genes of Endometrial Cancer.*"

GCF/Kea Simon Ovarian Cancer Research Grant

Two research projects were supported as part of this fund. This program is intended to support research related to ovarian cancer. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Ronald Alvarez, M.D., University of Alabama was a \$50,000 recipient for his application entitled, "*Melanoma Differentiation Associated 7 (mda-7) Gene: A Novel Multifunctional Anti-tumor Agent for Ovarian Cancer.*"

Robert Burger, M.D., UCI Medical Center was the recipient of a \$25,000 grant in support of his application entitled, "*The Role of ECA1 in Ovarian Carcinogenesis and Potential Utility as a Serum Marker.*"

GCF/Ovarian Cancer Research Grant

This research project is for one year at \$50,000. This program is intended to support research related to early detection focused primarily on treatment modality for women dealing with ovarian cancer and reoccurrences. All applications are reviewed by established investigators.

Christina Chu, M.D., University of Pennsylvania was the 2003 recipient of this research grant for her application entitled, "*Modification of Ovarian Tumor to Function as Primary Antigen Presenting Cells for Allogeneic Vaccination.*"

GCF/National Cancer Institute (NCI) Research Training Fellowship

The awardees will study at the National Cancer Institute for 2 years for \$50,000/year per trainee. Laboratories in all divisions of the NCI are available to this program. Applicants who are selected will be assisted in identifying the laboratory in which they will carry out their research. The applicant must have completed or be in the final year of an approved fellowship in gynecologic oncology. Each candidate is required to have three letters of recommendation, one of which must be from the director of the candidate's fellowship program.

Monica Jones, M.D., began her fellowship beginning in July 1999 for her project "Gene Expression Profiling in Ovarian Neoplasms" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at Mayo Clinic.

Amir Jazaeri, M.D., began his fellowship at NCI in July 2000 for his project "Use of cDNA Microarrays in Evaluation of Ovarian Cancer" and is currently carrying out his clinical work at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center in Texas.

Ginger Gardner, M.D., began her fellowship at NCI in July 2000 for her project "The Development and Characterization of Novel Retinoids for the Chemoprevention and Treatment of Ovarian Cancer" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York.

Kristin K. Zorn, M.D., began her fellowship at NCI in July 2001 for her project "Gene Expressions Profile of Ovarian Cancer Histologic Subtypes" and is currently carrying out her clinical work at University of Oklahoma.

In an effort to provide valuable information on gynecologic cancer to the public, the GCF provides an "Information Hotline."

Anyone who dials 1-800-444-4441 will be offered 5 types of information. All of these services are free:

- 1) By indicating their telephone area code, they will randomly receive the name, address and telephone of gynecologic oncologists in their area code;
- 2) Informational brochures such as "*Maintain Your Gynecologic Health*", *The Ovarian Cancer National Resource List*, "*Beating the Odds*", *After Breast Cancer: What you need to know about your gynecologic health*, *Renewing Intimacy and Sexuality* and the WCN.ORG brochures are sent by fax or mail if requested;
- 3) Information on the Women's Cancer Network (WCN) www.wcn.org;
- 4) Instructions for contacting the Gynecologic Cancer Foundation by mail or telephone;
- 5) A directory of all-gynecologic oncologists and related specialists will be sent by mail. This allows the caller to contact specialists outside their area code.

Patient Brochures

GCF developed a new brochure entitled *Renewing Intimacy and Sexuality After Gynecologic Cancer*. It was a much needed brochure that addresses a very important topic that unfortunately has not received much prior attention. Copies of this brochure are disseminated from the GCF Headquarters, GCF's 1-800-444-4441 Information Hotline, and mailed upon request to allied organizations and patient support groups.

Ovarian Cancer Product Guide

GCF developed a user-friendly product guide in a postcard format that summarizes all of the information, products and educational materials offered by organizations that are listed on its Ovarian Cancer National Resource List. The Ovarian Cancer Product Guide includes a brief description of the products and materials available through these organizations. This new guide allows women to review the available information so that they can get the most specific information relevant to their needs. This guide was supported by both GlaxoSmithKline and Ortho Biotech.

Annual Meeting Media Campaign

The Annual Meeting Media Campaign went head to head against one of the toughest media environments faced in the past four years. Three of the meetings most newsworthy research papers were strategically pitched to local and national media to gain the greatest impact in delivering the important message that gynecologic oncologists are making remarkable strides in women's cancer research and treatment. In addition, more journalists were in attendance at the event than ever in the history of the meetings' 34 years.

The campaign secured more than 130 placements in newspapers, journals, online and trade publications, reaching an audience of over 214 million people. Highlights include several stories in *Reuters Health*, *The Medical Post*, *USA Today*, *Vive Magazine*, *American Medical News*, *Glamour Magazine*, *Better Homes and Gardens* and several major market daily newspapers.

Hometown Radio Program

Results showed that it was another successful year for the SGO/GCF-sponsored radio program that connected gynecologic oncologists with radio stations in their hometown regions. Over 100 SGO members delivered key messages about gynecologic cancer awareness and the lifesaving role of gynecologic oncologists during their interviews. After the meeting, members received a warm welcome from their hometown media. In total, interviews ran on 1,368 stations and reached an audience of over 35 million people.

Public Service Award

GCF was honored to present an amazing woman with this prestigious award. The following is the 2003 GCF Public Service Award recipient:

Sheryl Silver, freelance writer and editor who has published more than 1,400 articles in *The Washington Post*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *The Chicago Tribune* and *The Atlanta Journal/Atlanta Constitution*. She also served as editor and a featured writer for more than 150 special advertising supplements published by *The Washington Post*.

Public Service Announcement (PSA)

GCF worked with the television actress Fran Drescher on the production of a PSA which promotes the Foundation's 1-800-444-4441 Information Hotline, Women's Cancer Network and the importance about early detection of gynecologic cancer. The PSA launched in May 2002 and by mid 2003 it had continued to grow in audience numbers. It has reached over 110 million viewers on over 145 different markets. It definitely is a PSA with longevity.

Video News Release (VNR)

GCF produced a Video News Release (VNR) to promote the Women's Cancer Network (wcn.org). It reached over half a million people across the country during February 28 - March 13. The VNR received airplay on the major networks - CBS, ABC and NBC. It also received featured airtime on CNBC and the Health Network, hitting 5 million viewers.

GCF produced another VNR featuring Karl Podratz, M.D., Ph.D., Bobbie Gostout, M.D. and ovarian cancer survivor Betty Noble and her husband. The VNR was for Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month (GCAM) and its key message was about seeing a gynecologic oncologist for treatment and the importance of early and regular screening. The wide distribution of this VNR has reached over 3 million television viewers in September in top markets, including New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, San Francisco, Boston, Miami, Dallas, Washington, Atlanta, Detroit, Seattle and Phoenix.

GCF is grateful to Ortho Biotech for their support of this news release.

Collaboration with Miss Universe Organization

GCF took its messages about prevention and detection to women through a new public service announcement featuring Miss USA, Susie Castillo, and her mom. The advertisement encourages women to take charge of their health by learning more about gynecologic cancers through information on the Women's Cancer Network Web site. The advertisement appeared in the October issue of *Woman's Day* magazine, which has a circulation of more than 4.2 million readers.

Leap for GCF

The fourth annual Leap for GCF run/walk event named "A Jazz Jog for GCF" was held at the SGO Annual Meeting in New Orleans, FL. More than 80 members participated in this event.

GCF's Allied Support Group

GCF hosts meetings with its Allied Support Group two times a year which brings together physicians, nurses, cancer survivors, and leaders from national organizations to update each other on programs and to talk about ways the organizations can collaborate on future projects. The member organizations who make up this group include: American Cancer Society, CancerCare, Centers for Disease Control, Conversations, Elizabeth Gillespie Fund For Life, FORCE, Gilda's Club Worldwide, Gynecologic Cancer Foundation, Gynecologic Oncology Group, National Cancer Institute, National Cervical Cancer Coalition, National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship, National Ovarian Cancer Association, National Ovarian Cancer Coalition, Ovarian Cancer National Alliance, Ovarian Cancer Research Fund, Office on Women's Health, SHARE, Society of Gynecologic Nurse Oncologists, The Lynne Cohen Foundation, The Wellness Community, and Society of Gynecologic Oncologists.

On Friday, January 31 the 19 member organizations of our Allied Support Group met in New Orleans, LA to update each other on new and current programs. They also worked on the development of a mission statement for the group as well as formulating some strategic planning. GCF welcomed 2 new members: Gilda's Club and Facing Our Risk of Cancer Empowered (FORCE). Gilda's Club focuses on women living with cancer and to provide emotional and social support to men, women and children with any kind of cancer. FORCE's goal is to provide information, support and guidance to women facing the risk of ovarian and/or breast cancers.

The second Allied Support Group Meeting was held on September 18 in San Francisco, CA. GCF is pleased to welcome our two most recent additions to the group: CancerCare and The Lynne Cohen Foundation for Ovarian Cancer Research. CancerCare is a national non-profit organization whose mission is to provide free professional help to people with all cancers through counseling, education, information and referral and direct financial assistance. The Lynne Cohen Foundation for Ovarian Cancer Research is an organization created in memory of Lynne Cohen who dedicated her life to the well-being of others. The mission is to continue her spirit of giving by supporting groundbreaking research to improve the survival rates for women with ovarian cancer.

GCF is thrilled to have Gilda's Club, FORCE, CancerCare and The Lynne Cohen Foundation for Ovarian Cancer Research as members of this important group.

Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month (GCAM)

For the fifth consecutive year, GCF set out to raise awareness and educate millions about the prevention, detection and treatment of gynecologic cancers during September - *Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month* (GCAM).

Many changes were made to both the design and content to update information and keep the "look and feel" current. GCF developed a new questionnaire about the usefulness of the kit that was included in the mid-July mailing to more than 3,000 GCF supporters. Additionally, a Spanish-language Web site - www.AhoraUSA.com (NowUSA) - recently translated GCF's press release announcing GCAM and published it online. The site has helped GCF in its communications efforts to Hispanic and Latina women.

Throughout September, GCF contacted more than 6,000 media outlets about GCAM with information about the importance of early and regular screenings for gynecologic cancers. Many top publications have published information about GCAM and gynecologic cancers, including *Better Homes and Gardens*, Yahoo! News, the *Connecticut Post*, *Glamour* and *Vive* Magazines. Other GCAM media outreach included an "on air" discussion with Barbara Goff, M.D., on the Vital Options radio show - a weekly syndicated cancer talk show.

Supplement Receives "Award of Excellence"

The "Gynecologic Cancer: What Every Woman Needs to Know" Supplement, developed for the Washington Post was so well received by the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE) that they awarded GCF a **2003 Award of Excellence**. Over 300 applications were submitted as part of ASAE's Associations Advancing America Awards Program, which recognizes associations that propel America forward.

GCF's Educational Supplement on "What Every Woman Needs To Know" in the New York Times Hits the Stands

GCF developed a 4 page educational supplement that appeared in the New York Times on Tuesday June 17 and again on Sunday June 22. The supplement which was distributed nationwide to over 3 million readers in conjunction with a special "Women's Health" section, featured critical gynecologic cancers, including advocacy issues, legislative updates and the importance of being treated by a gynecologic oncologist. GCF distributed more than 20,000 copies of the supplement to members of the Society of Gynecologic Oncologists, women's health organizations and cancer advocacy groups. The supplement was also featured on GCF's Web site and the Women's Cancer Network Web site.

Additionally, the supplement has been reprinted in four newspapers in Florida - the Florida Times Union-Jacksonville, the Tampa Tribune, the Orlando Sentinel and the News-Press (Fort Meyers), reaching a total of more than 1 million readers.

Spanish Supplement in *La Opinion*

In addition to the original distribution of The New York Times supplement, the information has also been translated into Spanish for distribution in the California newspaper *La Opinion*, the top Spanish-language newspaper in the U.S. with more than 470,000 readers each day. We are grateful to California State Senator Oritz, for her help in securing an endowment for translation and publication. The Spanish version of the supplement appeared in September and will also appear on the WCN site and GCF's site. Many Latino organizations are linked to the information. Additionally, this version of the supplement contained a picture of our recent public service advertisement on the front page.

States Declared Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month (GCAM)

GCF has partnered with Women In Government on its campaign to have state governors declare September as Gynecologic Cancer Awareness Month. Together, GCF and the Women in Government Organization sent a letter to all state representatives asking them to seek a proclamation from their governor. Letters were also sent to governors by GCF members (as part of the GCAM publicity kit) and other supporters. An impressive 28 governors made formal declarations.

GCF is grateful to the Women in Government Organization for their wonderful efforts in support of GCAM.

The State of the State Annual Report

GCF has created an annual report to the women of America about the "State" of gynecologic cancers. This report, which will be developed each year and distributed to the media, the public, and key organizations and policymakers, describes each major gynecologic cancer and the medical advances and latest developments within each cancer area. Physicians from the Society of Gynecologic Oncologists drafted each respective cancer section ensuring that this first "State of the State of Gynecologic Cancers" will be a resounding success. It was distributed late September.

GCF is grateful to Ortho Biotech for providing an unrestricted educational grant to support the report.

Cervical Cancer Public Education Campaign

GCF was excited to be named the new lead partner of the Cervical Cancer Public Education Campaign. The goal of the campaign is to reduce the burden of disease, unnecessary procedures and preventable deaths caused each year by cervical cancer through increased education, outreach and communication between women and their health care providers.

Partners of GCF's National Cervical Cancer Public Education Campaign came together in September in Washington, D.C. to discuss plans for the Campaign and ways they can work together to inform women about cervical cancer, screening and treatment. The meeting brought together 15 Campaign partners from across the country and gave GCF, as the lead partner, an opportunity to articulate its vision for the Campaign, describe plans for upcoming activities and meet partners one-on-one. Ideas exchanged in the future will help the Campaign strengthen its effort for January, Cervical Cancer Screening Month, as well as develop new strategies and plans for Campaign outreach efforts. At the meeting, partners also welcomed and thanked a new sponsor, Cytyc Corporation, who joined Digene Corporation as a corporate supporter of the Campaign. The member organizations that make up the campaign include: America Online, American Cancer Society-Mid-Atlantic Division, American College of Nurse-Midwives, American Medical Women's Association, American Social Health Association, Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses, Business and Professional Women, Cancer Research Foundation of America, Gynecologic Cancer Foundation, National Alliance for Hispanic Health, National Asian Women's Health Organization, National Black Nurses Association, National Cervical Cancer Coalition, national Coalition for Cancer Survivorship, National council for La Raza, National Education Association Health Information Network, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Society of Gynecologic Oncologists, Society of Gynecologic Nurse Oncologists, Society for Women's Health Research, Women In Government, and Young Women's Christian Association.

GCF is grateful to the Digene Corporation and the Cytyc Corporation which have provided unrestricted educational grants in support of this Campaign.

Outreach Course for African-American Women

On February 1, over 200 women attended an awareness course specifically geared toward bringing gynecologic cancer awareness to African-American women in the New Orleans area. The course addressed issues such as the role of nutrition and exercise in prevention, prevalence of the disease in African-American women, as well as what factors put women at risk for breast, colon and cervical cancers. GCF and its Cervical Cancer Public Education Campaign and the Cure organization sponsored this course.

The Gynecologic Cancer Education Awareness Act of 2003 - Johanna's Law

In September of 2002 supplement editor and GCF Public Service Award Winner, Sheryl Silver, contacted Karen Carlson to discuss a legislative initiative related to gynecologic cancer awareness that she intended to pursue. She was hoping to gain some assurance that if her efforts with Congressman Sander Levin were successful that GCF would support these efforts and in addition mobilize its Allied Support Group as part of this process. This bill has become a reality and named by Congressman Levin "Johanna's Law" in honor of Sheryl and her sister. The bill authorizes a National Gynecologic Cancer Early Detection and Awareness Campaign to be directed by the NIH.

Women's Cancer Network (WCN)

Since its inception, the Women's Cancer Network (www.wcn.org) was established to provide an up-to-date information resource about gynecologic and other female cancers. Over the past few years, the site has been home to the *first* online risk survey in all of medicine. Many enhancements were made to the WCN in 2003. Some include the expansion of the Calendar of Events section, enhancement of the Find a Doctor searchable database, an increase of the Survivor section with the Wall of Hope, feature articles, cancer topics, FAQs, and links to other reliable cancer resources. The site has been accessed over 10 million times in a one year period. GCF partnered with CancerSource.com to help take this award-winning and well respected resource to an entirely new level by making the WCN the premier site of information about women's cancers on the Internet. Thank you to Bristol-Myers Squibb Oncology, for their generous support of making this a reality.

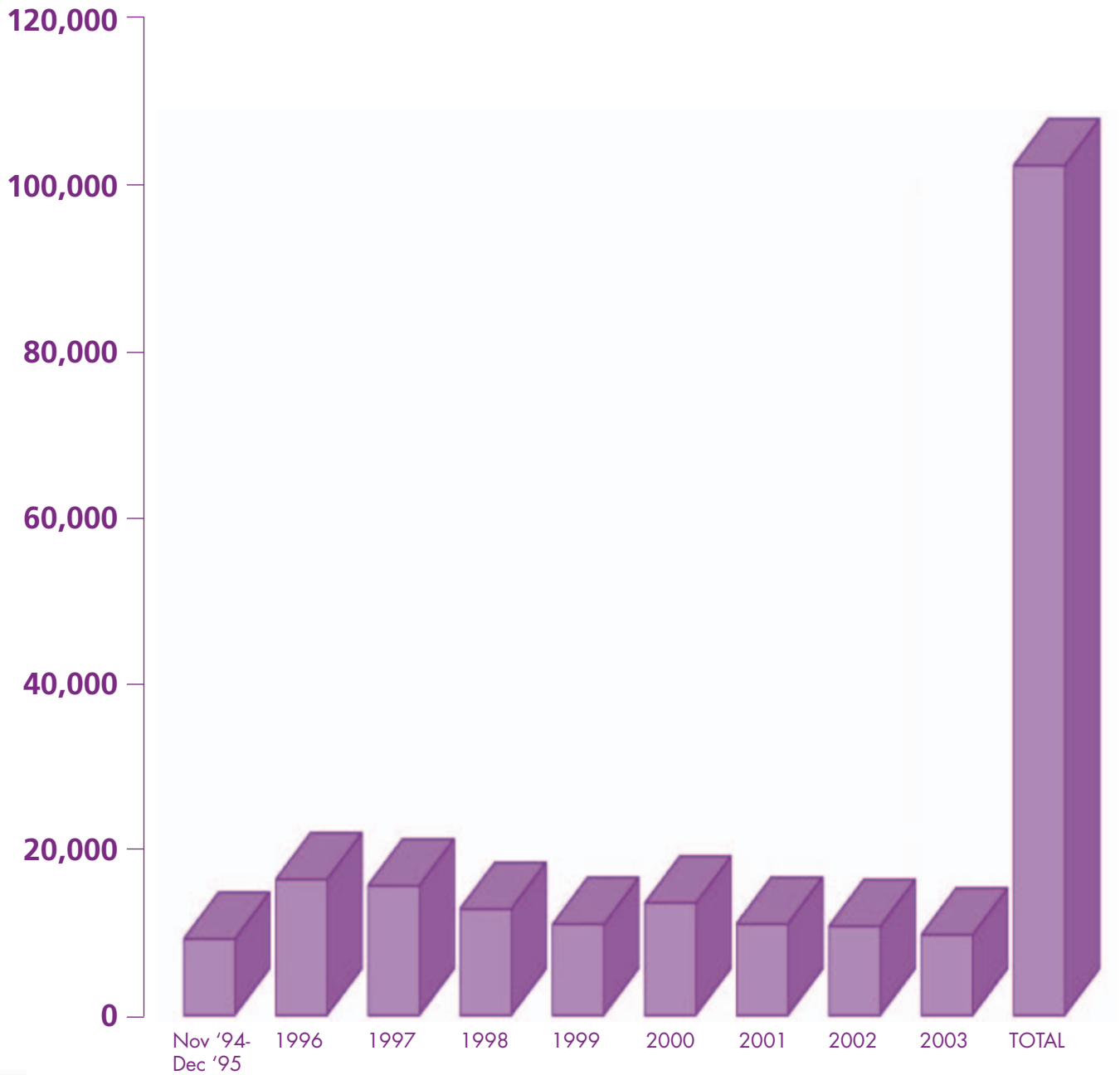
